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11.	Staff Experience Equivalency for IQAF Assignments	
	 ACEC-Ontario raised concern regarding 3 recent RFPs for CA assignments on traditional DBB projects that stated experience in the IQAF Manager role on P3 projects is not recognized as equivalent to the CA role on traditional assignments despite the need for the IQAF Manager to have been a CA on past similar MTO contracts. MTO does recognize inspector roles on Infrastructure Ontario (IO) and Metrolinx (Mx) projects as equivalent. ACEC-Ontario and MTO are of the view that more discussion is required.

12.	Form 5 (Staffing Availability Declaration)	
	 Form 5 is intended to confirm staffing availability for full time, on-site staff. It will be adjusted for each assignment but will, generally, include the CA, ACA and inspectors. It is not intended for individuals not on site full time such as the PM or specialists. The form is intended to address situations when service providers need to substitute staff before starting work or could not start work as staff identified in their proposal are unavailable. Form 5 brings the discussion and awareness to the forefront so that the impacts on projects can be considered in a proactive way. If the declaration is improperly filled out it will be treated similarly to other aspects that are incorrect in the contract. ACEC-Ontario does not believe this will solve the issue. It was suggested that proposals be evaluated as submitted and if the service provider is unable to fully staff up, they are disqualified and MTO award to the next qualified service provider.

	 Inspector Qualification Requirements Previously, when a proposed individual could demonstrate current status as an Engineer-in-Training (EIT), MTO could consider that individual to possess an equivalency to an OACETT rsji or rcsi designation. As of May 15, 2023, PEO will no longer be offering the EIT Program to new applicants. ACEC-Ontario wants to ensure that whatever new process is implemented to fill the vacancy left by the cancellation of the EIT Program by PEO does not "leave anyone behind", including accredited international Engineering graduates. ACEC-Ontario asked that consideration be given to a process that does not create unnecessary administrative burden or costs to individuals.
