

Referee and Adjudication Decisions

 The following chart is based on 95 referee decisions and 49 adjudication determinations since the start of the referee and adjudication processes for MTO contracts. One referee decision was removed from the data as the decision included only a time component.



- 61% of all referee and adjudication decisions awarded \$0 to the contractor.
- 4% of all referee and adjudication decisions awarded the contractor with between 91% and 100% of the claimed value of their submission.

Breakdown for Fiscal 2025/2026 April 1, 2025, to June 30, 2025

• There have been no referee or adjudication decisions in the first quarter of 2025/2026.

D. Analysis

- MTO considers that, in general, referee and adjudication decisions seem to support MTO's position and indicate that MTO is reasonable in its assessment of claim principle and quantum. Most decisions do not support the contractor's claim amounts but rather are closer to the MTO position (which may include an acknowledgement of some MTO responsibility for a portion of the claim amount).
- Over half (61%) of the referee and adjudication decisions/determinations were denials of the contractor claims in their entirety since the new claims process was implemented. Referee and Adjudication decisions have awarded on average 11.7% of the claim value submitted since 2017.
 - For F2025-26 the average is n/a,
 - For F2024-25 the average is 18.8%, and
 - For F2023-24 the average is 9.9%.
